When a 7.8 earthquake rocked Mexico City in September, our **global family** also came together in an extraordinary way.

Working with Pastor Martin Guerena (left in photo) of Northwest Chapel (Dublin, Ohio), we pulled together a team of Spanish speakers from the Americas—from Mexico, Argentina, USA, and Chile.

This powerful Trauma Care team ministered to many Mexican believers—first in helping them process their own trauma, and then by equipping them to reach out and help others in their church and community.

Now the push is on to train up a core of trauma care workers for future teams. To this end we are hosting a Trauma Care Workshop Jan. 13-15 in Columbus, Ohio.


Jesus Munoz is my hero for carrying so much of our responses to Spanish-speaking countries. Loves the Lord and people, and understands crisis ministry.
